# Aims and objectives

At Great Alne Primary School our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- promotes the ethos of our school
- provides a sense of belonging and identity
- sets an appropriate tone for education
- is practical and smart
- makes all children feel equal to their peers, in terms of appearance;
- sets a high standard of appearance for all,

# The role of our Governing Board

This is based on the following document <a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/school-uniform/scho

Guidance from the Department for Education requires that governors:

- engage with parents and pupils when designing their uniform policy or when making any significant changes - these views should be considered in determining the final policy
- consider how the introduction of the proposed uniform policy might affect groups represented in the school, especially those who share protected characteristics as defined by the Equality Act 2010
- consider how comfortable the proposed uniform will be for pupils
- take a sensible approach to allow for exceptions to be made during extreme weather, for example, allowing pupils to wear shorts in very hot weather or allowing trousers to be worn instead of skirts in very cold weather
- ensure that their uniform is suitable and safe for pupils who walk or cycle to school, for instance, by allowing pupils to wear a coat which they could be visible in when it is dark going home
- choose a PE kit which is practical, comfortable, appropriate to the activity involved and affordable

### The role of parents

We expect all parents:

- to support the school uniform policy
- to send children to school correctly dressed and well-presented, including a suitable hair style; ready for their daily schoolwork.
- to ensure their children come to school with a coat suitable for the forecast weather conditions each day.
- To ensure that all items of clothing are named.

Any request to change uniform can be applied for. All requests should be made to the Head Teacher.

If a pupil is not wearing an item of uniform as identified in this policy, a member of staff will speak to parents informally. If the situation is not resolved, a letter will be sent home identifying which item is not suitable ( see appendix ). After two letters about the same item in a school year, the parents/ carers will be invited to discuss the matter further with the Head Teacher.

### **Uniform List**

## **Boys**

White polo shirt
Maroon school round neck sweat shirt, embroidered with school logo
Grey trousers or shorts (for summer)
Grey or black socks
Black school shoes (not trainers)

#### **Girls**

White polo shirt
Maroon school round neck sweat shirt, embroidered with school logo OR
Maroon school cardigan style sweat shirt, embroidered with school logo
Grey skirt, pinafore or trousers
White or grey socks
Grey tights
Sensible, black shoes
Summer uniform
Pale-blue check summer dress

# PE (Uni-sex)

Pale blue school tee-shirt (option: embroidered with school badge)
Maroon shorts
Maroon or navy track suit
Black pumps (KS 1 and 2)
Trainers (KS 2 only)

### <u>Additional Information</u>

- Long hair should be tied back at all times
- 'Extreme' haircuts are **not** permitted in school ('extreme' being any haircut that is considered by the school to be significantly different so as to cause distraction to others, and therefore their learning; and therefore not in keeping with the school's ethos. Examples of haircuts not permitted include: tram lines or equivalent, shaved sides with longer hair across the centre, use of hair products such as gel. When joining the school, parents / carers are expected to fully support this policy at all times.
- Children should not wear jewellery, except small, plain studs for pierced ears and wrist watches both of which must be removed for P.E. (ear studs can be covered with plasters for the first few weeks until they can be safely removed)

- Children should wear a suitable coat or outer garment for the forecast weather.
- Make-up or nail varnish should not be worn in school.
- Children may wear caps or hats to protect themselves from the sun or adverse weather conditions. All headwear must be of plain colour. These items should not to be worn indoors.
- All children will need a clear & labelled water bottle bought into school daily.
- Book-bags are available from the school office.
