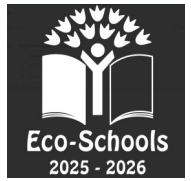




News from Great Alne Primary School

Thank you all for your ongoing support. Have a relaxing and restful weekend!

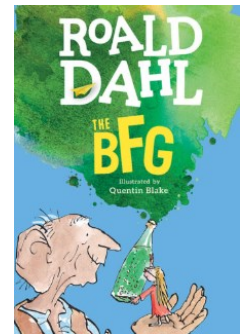
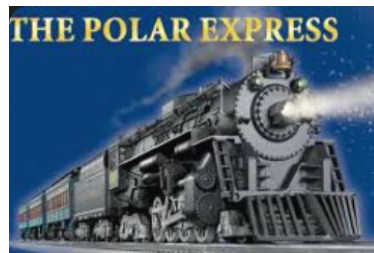
